The 10th Essex regularly take part in displays on behalf of the National Trust. They have marched in the Lord Mayor's Parade and have been involved in the making of several BBC documentaries about the period.

- See the troops in training and on parade.
- Inspect the camp kitchen and sample the hot rations.
- Enjoy the talks and demonstrations that will take place throughout the day.
- Speak with the men to get a feel of what life was like in the trenches.
- Discover what impact the Great War had on Epsom and Ewell.
- Research your ancestors' wartime history.
- Bring in family memorabilia for help in identification.
- See displays of medals won for gallantry.
- Try out the troop's kit and see what weapons they used.
